JOB DESCRIPTION

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

I. Collaboration and Professional Conduct:

- A. Willingly cooperate with colleagues, school administration, and pastoral staff to maintain a Christ-centered, edifying, and harmonious atmosphere.
- B. Attend all required staff functions, including teacher workdays, orientation, staff meetings, and school-wide performances/ ceremonies.
- C. Assume responsibility for professional growth and keeping materials, supplies, and skills current.
- D. Model professional, moral, and ethical standards as well as personal integrity in all interactions, and comply with and support school regulations and policies.
- E. Work in a collegial and collaborative manner with peers, school personnel, and the community to promote and support student learning.
- F. Maintain and respect confidentiality of student and school personnel information.
- G. Maintain proper boundaries with students at all times, assuring respect for the ethical and legal duties in the staff-student relationship and the essential duty to witness to students through your conduct.
- H. Provide a good role model of a professional and of a Christ Follower in appearance, demeanor, dress, and behavior.

II. Instruction and Planning:

- A. Meet and instruct students in assigned locations and times, and closely adhere to the course pacing guidelines.
- B. Design differentiated and coherent instruction to achieve desired objectives and include engaging learning experiences that make the subject matter meaningful for all students
- C. Submit any curriculum requests for administrative approval prior to use and follow the full scope and sequence for each assigned class.
- D. Select, evaluate, and refine a variety of teaching methods and instructional strategies for active student engagement and improvement of student learning.
- E. Implement a classroom management policy that aligns with school discipline policies and fosters a safe and positive learning environment that maximizes instructional time.
- F. Ensure adequate and safe supervision of students at all times.

III. Assessment and Progress Monitoring:

- A: Diagnose individual, group, and program needs, planning for the appropriate use of time, materials, and resources to match the ability and needs of all students.
- B. Evaluate students' progress, providing specific evaluative feedback, maintaining records, and preparing progress reports.

- C. Use a variety of assessment strategies and instruments to make short-term and long-range instructional decisions to improve student learning.
- D. Attend training sessions and administer standardized tests in accordance with established procedures.
- E. Identify and communicate specific student performance expectations, documenting student learning gains using appropriate assessment instruments.

IV. Communication:

- A. Establish and maintain positive rapport with students that motivates students to achieve their maximum potential.
- B. Model and teach behaviors that are encouraging healthy social interaction, active engagement, and self-motivation.
- C. Appropriately submit incident reports or other concerns to school leadership.
- D. Work in a collegial and collaborative manner with peers, school personnel, and the community to promote and support student learning.
- E. Commit to regular school-to-home communication and relationship building for all students.
- F. Follow the Biblical model of conflict resolution when disagreements occur with colleagues, volunteers or parents of students.
